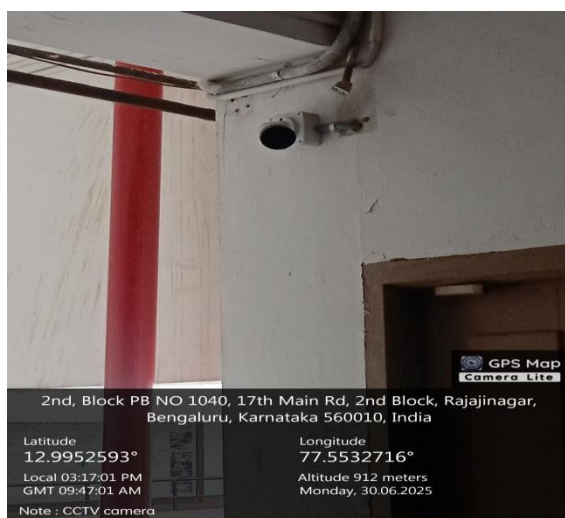


## Anti Ragging Compliance Report

- The Anti-Ragging Committee is involved in designing strategies and action plan for curbing the menace of ragging in the college by adopting an array of activities. The constitution of Anti Ragging committee at KLE College of Pharmacy, Bengaluru.
- The college has a mandatory anti-ragging undertaking column in the college's admission application form. In compliance of the second amendment in UGC Regulations, it is compulsory for each student and every parent to submit an online Anti-Ragging undertaking affidavit every academic year.
- The presence of surveillance cameras can induce a sense of discipline among students, thereby promoting a conducive learning environment. CCTV cameras installed at vital points such as corridors, classrooms, laboratories, office entrance, Common rooms, etc. The implementation and effective utilization of Closed-Circuit Television (CCTV) facilities play a vital role in ensuring the safety and security of a college campus.

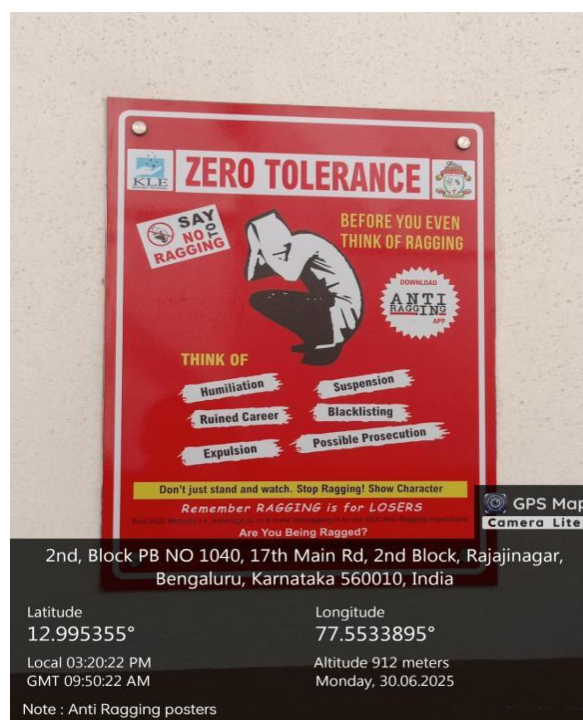
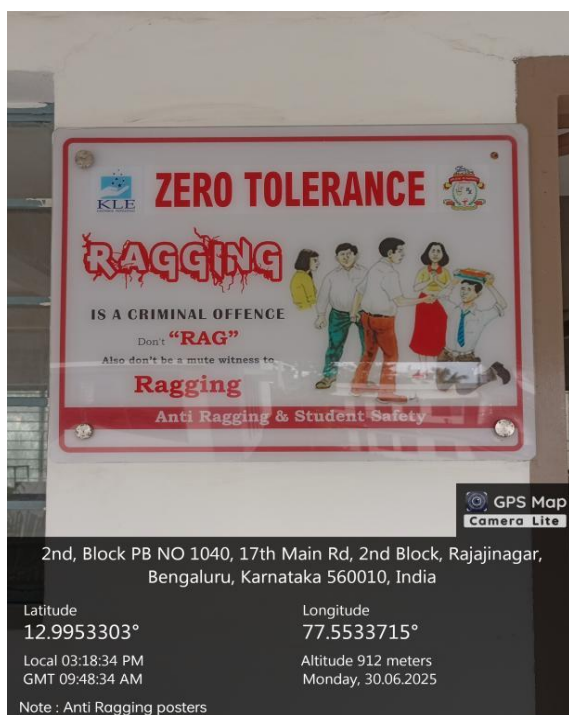


- An orientation program is a structured introduction for newcomers to their new environment. It also help students transition into college life, understand academic expectations, and connect with the campus community. 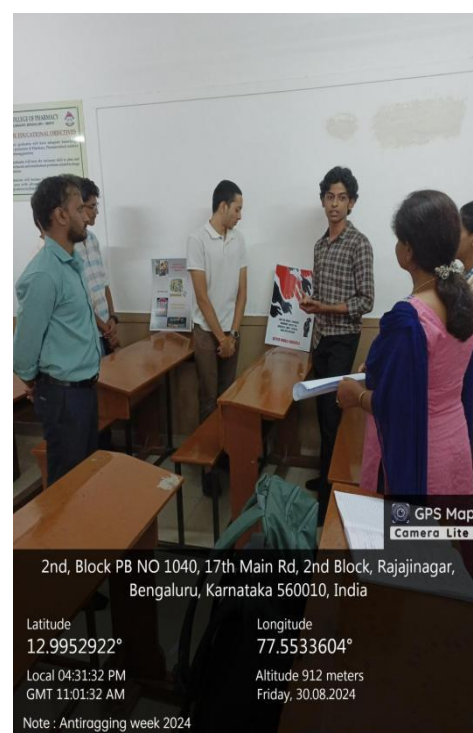
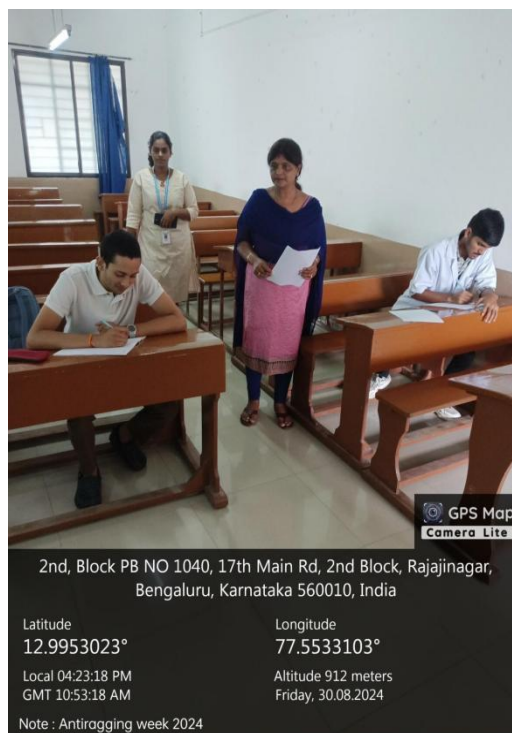
These programs often include introductions to staff, campus tours, information sessions, and opportunities to connect with peers.



- To address ragging, college is proactively identified potential triggers and displayed anti-ragging posters in prominent areas. These posters are displayed in high-traffic locations like corridors, classrooms, laboratories, and near the office entrance, common rooms, clearly outlining the consequences of ragging and providing contact information for reporting incidents.



- To address potential ragging incidents, surprise inspections of hostels, classrooms, and other areas frequented by students are mandated by educational institutions. These inspections, conducted by Anti-Ragging Squads, aim to ensure compliance with anti-ragging norms and create a safe environment.
- Anti Ragging week is dedicated to raising awareness about the dangers of ragging and promoting a safe and inclusive environment in educational institutions. Anti Ragging week conducted on 12<sup>th</sup>-18th August 2024 by organizing poster presentation and essay writing competition. The Essay writing competition and Poster presentation Competition and short film, themed 'Anti-Ragging' was an engaging event that showcased students' artistic talents and reinforced the institution's commitment to fostering a respectful and safe campus environment. Through creative expression and dialogue, students could contribute to the awareness and prevention of ragging on campus.



- The University Grants Commission (UGC) developed a set of 30-second TV commercials, each with a different perspective on ragging were shown to students for raise awareness among students. Additionally, two documentary films on anti-ragging were produced and shown to students. These resources were intended to be shown to students, to educate students about the dangers of ragging.
